The CPA license adds a great deal of value to a standard accounting degree. According to Department of Labor statistics, a CPA earns on average 10-15% more than an unlicensed accountant per year. To sit for the CPA exam in the state of Texas, candidates must have at least 150 hours of college credit (undergraduate or graduate work) that includes 30 hours of upper-division accounting, 24 hours of related business classes, 2 research components, and business communication course. The proposed program adds enough credits to the current accounting emphasis for a student to be able to sit for the exam upon graduation.

Job Market

Accounting majors will find jobs such as auditor, controller, cost estimator, accounting clerk, accounting analyst, financial analyst, accounting manager, asset manager, and budget analyst to name a few. Individuals can work in fields such as the corporate accounting or the federal tax industry. Some of our graduates choose to continue their education in graduate school resulting in successful careers in many of these fields at an even higher level.

Job Outlook

The Center on Education and the Workforce (2022) reported that Accounting is a popular undergraduate degree that can lead to high earnings. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, between the years 2021 and 2031 there will be an increase of about 81,800 (6%) jobs for accountants and auditors, just as fast as the average for all occupations. Financial analysts will find about 31,900 jobs between 2021-2031(9% growth).

Earnings

Earnings potential for graduates with accounting degrees vary widely depending on many factors including the geographic location, the industry you choose, position, skills and experience. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (2021), the median annual income of tax examiners and collectors, and revenue agents is \$56,780 while accountants and auditors earn an annual median salary of \$77,250. The median annual income for financial managers is \$131,710.

Business Core Courses Required of all BBA students.

*BUAD 202 is required of all Freshman BBA majors. Junior level transfer students may substitute a business elective for this class with approval from their advisor. Southwestern students who are changing from another major to a BBA are also required to take BUAD 202 unless their advisor recommends an alternative.
